Ring in the New Year at First Night Buffalo

Annual drug- and alcohol-free event marks 30 years of New Year's festivities downtown

BUFFALO, N.Y. (Dec. 14, 2018) – The Western New York community is invited to join the Independent Health Foundation as they present the 30th annual First Night[®] Buffalo, the ultimate drug- and alcohol-free New Year's Eve celebration. This year's event will be held from 5 to 10 p.m., Monday, Dec. 31, at the Buffalo Niagara Convention Center.

The Independent Health Foundation and its partners gave a sneak peak of this year's lineup at a media event Friday at the Buffalo Niagara Convention Center. The annual holiday tradition offers safe, family-friendly activities for all ages to ring in the New Year.

As always, the event will feature plenty of rides and amusements. Popular returning attractions include Hybrid Fitness – Ninja Warrior Academy, Jeff Musial – The Animal Guy, the Bubble Black Light Dance Party, drum line DownBeat Percussion (you may also recognize them as the Buffalo Bills Stampede), the Toddler Zone, and Storybook Characters.

New attractions this year include laser tag, ComedySportz, and even more rides and bounce houses.

To cap off the event at 9:45 p.m. there will be a special countdown with In Jest Variety Show featuring Nels Ross, followed by a confetti- and balloon-drop.

First Night Buffalo, which draws approximately 5,000 people from the city and suburbs each year, has outlived many similar events across the country.

A group of artists and civic-minded citizens founded First Night in Boston in 1976 as an alternative to traditional New Year's Eve festivities. WNY United Against Drug & Alcohol Abuse, in cooperation with Rich Products, initiated First Night in downtown Buffalo on Dec. 31, 1989.

The "first" First Night featured the up-and-coming Goo Goo Dolls, the Ramrods, Outer Circle Orchestra, blues musician Billy McEwen, comedy shows, dance performances, and more. The former Marine Midland Bank sponsored a "Light the Night" procession down Court Street.

In 1992, Independent Health, through its Foundation, secured the event and has proudly presented it for the past 27 years, said Carrie Meyer, executive director of the Independent Health Foundation.

"For some perspective, when the 'first' First Night debuted Dec. 31, 1989, the Bills led the AFC East heading into the playoffs, Jimmy Griffin was mayor of Buffalo, Phil Housley played for the Sabres, and a gallon of gas cost 97 cents," she remarked. "First Night has truly survived the test of time."

Michael W. Cropp, M.D., president and chief executive officer of Independent Health, added, "Independent Health is pleased to continue to sponsor First Night Buffalo, a mainstay event in our region, which engages our community in healthy, fun, and safe activities to ring in the New Year. I hope families leave our First Night celebration with lasting memories and feel inspired to participate in healthy activities throughout the year."

Mayor Byron W. Brown also lent his support and encouraged families to come out for the event.

"The year 2018 will be soon coming to an end, and for those looking for a fun, responsible way to bring in the new year, please consider attending First Night Buffalo," said Brown.
